- It is comprised of age-appropriate scripts and corresponding movies for each grade level, Pre-K through 6th grade, and topic specific scripts and movies for secondary schools. There are a total of 14 unique presentations and movies.
- In addition to covering sexual and physical abuse, the upper grade level programs for middle and high school include relevant and timely topics: harassment and respect, sexting/cyberbullying, healthy relationships, imbalance of power and sexual abuse, dating violence, and non-stranger rape.

January Human Trafficking Awareness Month

Human Trafficking is defined as:

- sex trafficking in which a commercial sex act is induced by force, fraud, or coercion, or in which the person induced to perform such act has not attained 18 years of age; or
- the recruitment, harboring, transportation, provision, or obtaining of a person for labor or services through the use of force, fraud, or coercion for the purpose of subjection to involuntary servitude, peonage, debt bondage, or slavery.

Trafficking Indicators

- Is the victim in possession of identification and travel documents; if not, who has control of the documents? ↖
- Was the victim coached on what to say to law enforcement and immigration officials
- Was the victim recruited for one purpose and forced to engage in some other job?
- Is the victim's salary being garnished to pay off a smuggling fee? (Paying off a smuggling fee alone is not considered trafficking.)
- Was the victim forced to perform sexual acts?
- Does the victim have freedom of movements?
- Has the victim or family been threatened with harm if the victim attempts to escape ↘
- Has the victim been threatened with deportation or law enforcement action?
- Has the victim been harmed or deprived of food, water, sleep, medical care, or other life necessities?
- Can the victim freely contact friends or family?
- Is the victim a juvenile engaged in commercial sex?
- Is the victim allowed to socialize or attend religious services?
